**Isis Hospitality Gives Back Fund to make contributions to local charities

The event will be held at 11:00 a.m. at the WaTiki Waterpark, 1416 N. Elk Vale Road, Rapid City. The Isis Hospitality Gives Back Fund will be represented by the founding partners and Rich Dunkelberger, Chief Executive Officer, ISIS Hospitality and William Day, III, Manager, Sliders Restaurant. The 2011 charitable recipients are:

On Saturday, February 12, 2011, the Isis Hospitality Group, which includes WaTiki Indoor Waterpark Resort, Sliders Bar & Grill, the Fairfield Inn and Suites and LaQuinta Inn and Suites, hosted the fourth annual fundraising event and allocated 100% of all sales to local charities. The event set a record of \$45,000 raised. WaTiki Indoor Waterpark resort is the largest indoor waterpark resort in the Dakotas, with 30,000 square feet of waterpark, games, casual dining and over 250 hotel accommodations.

The Isis Hospitality Gives Back donor advised fund at BHACF was established in 2009 (originally called the WaTiki Gives Back Fund) to facilitate the charitable giving of the Isis Hospitality partners and affiliated organizations. Founded in 1987, BHACF holds endowment funds for agencies in the Black Hills area, as well as donor-advised funds and scholarship funds.
